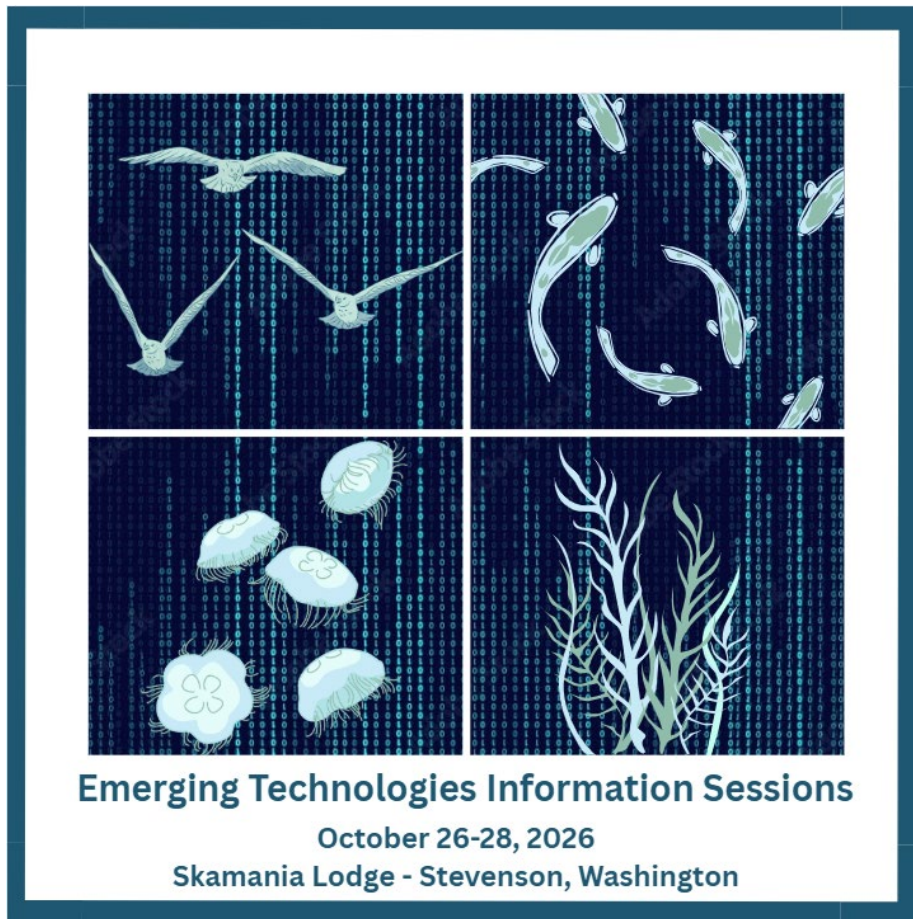

At the January PNAMP Fish Monitoring Work Group (FMWG) meeting, Greg Wilke (Database and Application Manager, Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission) gave an overview of the [Regional Mark Processing Center](#) (RMPC) and Regional Mark Inventory System (RMIS) and Kris Warner (Fish and Wildlife Biologist, Region 5 North-Hatchery Monitoring and Evaluation, Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife) demonstrated how he uses the [RMIS R package](#). Participants helped identify improvements and other ways to make RMIS and the R package more user-friendly, but we could use more feedback.
